

The Cambridge and Concord Turnpike. by an act of Corporation passed the 8th day of March 1803 have leave to make a turnpike road from Cambridge to Concord in said County of Middlesex, beginning at or near the dwelling house of Jonas Wyeth in Cambridge and from thence to continue a westerly course south of Dr Andrew Craigie's summer house. and on said course to the bridge over the river running out of Fresh Pond, so called. &c.

Sept 4th 1804

Laid out and defined as follows:-

"Beginning at a stake and stones by the road near the northerly end of Jonas Wyeth's barn. Thence running a westerly course on a straight line on lands of Samuel Hunt and Andrew Craigie to a stake and stones in land of said Craigie. Thence on a straight line thro' land of the heirs of Aaron Hill deceased to a stake and stones by a town way; thence crossing said way, and thro' lands of Andrew Craigie, Jonas Wyeth, said A. Craigie, Jane Lee, and heirs of Thomas Brattle deceased to a stake and stones by the highway at Fresh Pond; thence on the old road and over the river southerly of the old bridge to a swampy oak, marked, in land of John W. Apthorpe, &c. The bounds described being on the southerly side of the road, and said road is laid out fifty feet in all places where it is not otherwise particularly mentioned."
