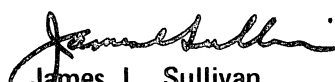

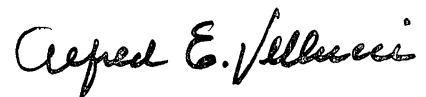

WITH THE EXPANDED CAMBRIDGE RECYCLING PROGRAM, YOU CAN  
NOW SAVE AND RECYCLE EVERYTHING FROM A USED REFRIGERATOR  
TO AN OLD LOVE LETTER.

### PAPER

1. Save any paper that is flat or can be flattened. For example newspapers, magazines, cardboard, lottery tickets, paper bags.
2. Tie securely in bundles 6—8 inches high.
3. Place bundles to one side of your trash on your regular collection day.
4. Paper pick-ups are **every other week as of June 7th**.

### WHITE METALS

1. Place large objects (stoves, refrigerators) at the curb on your normal collection day.
2. Large metals are picked up **every other week as of June 14th**.

### GLASS CONTAINERS AND METAL CANS

1. Save all glass containers and metal cans. Only glass you can see through is recyclable.
2. Keep clear glass in one container, and colored glass (brown, green) in another container.
3. Place cans together with glass in either container.
4. It is not necessary to wash or remove labels.
5. Bring cans and glass to the **NEW CAMBRIDGE RECYCLING CENTERS**:

1. Norfolk Street — From Cambridge St. near the DPW
2. Fresh Pond — New Street, behind the Shopping Center at the old dump site.

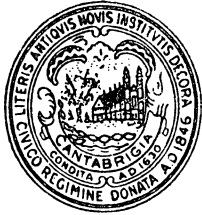

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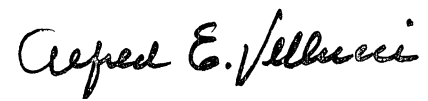
