

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Ordinance,
relating to the execution of Deeds by the City.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. All deeds, conveyances, leases, and other instruments, which shall be given by the City, and which, to be valid in law, must be signed, sealed, and acknowledged, shall be signed and acknowledged by the Mayor on behalf of the City, and shall be by him sealed with the common seal of the City.

2. Whenever the amount due and payable on any mortgage, belonging to the City, shall be paid to the City Treasurer, the City Treasurer shall certify the same to the Mayor, who shall thereupon discharge the mortgage, or, by and with the consent of the Board of Aldermen, may assign the same; and, for that purpose, the Mayor shall execute and deliver all necessary deeds and instruments.
