In Board of Aldermen, August 7, 1861.

Ordered, That due notice be given that it is the intention of this Board to alter the line of Brattle Street on the Southernly side, near Ash Street, in front of the estate of James Greenleaf, by making a uniform curve, as delineated on a Plan by W. A. Cleason, now on file in the office of the City Clerk, Street-Plans, Vol. 1, Page 11, and, for this purpose, to discontinue a portion of said Brattle Street, and also to take certain land of said Greenleaf; and that any and all parties interested in the question of said alteration, discontinuance, and taking, may appear and be heard at the next meeting of this Board to be holden on Wednesday, the twenty-first day of August-current, at 10 o'clock, A.M.
