OSBORNE—Gordon of Lincoln and Boston, passed away in Boston on August 22, 2000, at the age of 93 after a long and courageous battle with Parkinson's Disease. Born on November 6, 1906, in Mussoorie, India, he was the son of George Frederick Folger Osborne, Royal Engineer, and Louisa Molyneux S.L. (Gordon) Osborne. He was the husband of Marjorie Benson Osborne and the late Freda Wendell (Clarke) Osborne and the brother of the late Isa Cornelia Osborne of Canada and the late Dorothy Osborne Xanthaky of Portugal. Gordon was a member of the class of 1922 at the Gunnery School, Washington, Connecticut. Because he was too young for college, he joined the Indian Army and spent the next two years in India. It was there that his lifelong interest in textile manufacturing began. In 1928 he received a Bachelor of Textile Engineering from the Lowell Technological Institute (now University of Lowell), from which he was also awarded an Honorary D.Sc. He taught textile engineering at the University of North Carolina and M.I.T. before joining the staff of Warwick Mills in 1934. He started their first technical department in 1935, became vice president of manufacturing in 1943 and president and treasurer in 1948. Warwick Mills was and still is a leading weaver of hi-tech industrial fabrics, especially sailcloth. At the time of his retirement, he had completed over 60 years of employment with Warwick. Gordon was a member of Northern Textile Association, the oldest trade association in the U.S. He joined as a student in 1927 and served in various positions, including Treasurer. In 1994 he was honored with a gold medal from NTA for his contributions to the textile industry. He was a member of the Union Club of Boston, The Harvard Club of Boston, The Athenaeum Library of Boston, Trustee of the American Textile History Museum in Lowell, and Fellow of The Textile Institute, Manchester, England. In the past he was a director of Massachusetts Audubon and the American Mutual Insurance Company and a member of the Union League Club of New York. He was also affiliated with the Tsongas Industrial History Center, Lowell, MA. Mr. Osborne leaves his wife, Marjorie Benson Osborne and many friends and colleagues who will miss him greatly. Services will be private, with interment in St. John's Cemetery, Washington, Connecticut.
