Mr. Raymond G. D'Arcy, retired Headmaster of Cambridge High and Latin School, had for forty-five years devoted his life to the teaching and counseling of the children in our public schools, and

WHEREAS:

Mr. D'Arcy attended local public schools, graduating from Cambridge High and Latin in 1922, Harvard University in 1926 and Harvard Graduate School in 1930 receiving a Master's Degree in Education, and

WHEREAS:

Mr. D'Arcy's teaching career began at his high school alma mater in 1926, where he taught until 1928 when he was appointed a teacher at Rindge Technical School, a position he held until 1941 when Mr. D'Arcy was promoted to Master of the Putnam School and remained in that position until 1950 when he became Master of the Peabody School and served in that position until 1965 when he became Headmaster of Cambridge High and Latin School, a position which he held with distinction until his retirement on June 30, 1973, and

WHEREAS:

Mr. D'Arcy was loved by all who knew him for his understanding as a human being concerned with the education of our youth as well as for his capabilities as an administrator as shown by the various managerial positions he held since 1941, now therefore be it

That this City Council go on record extending our sincere gratitude to Mr. Raymond G. D'Arcy for his tireless effort and dedication shown to so many during his career as a teacher and an administrator, and be it further
