The Committee on Watering Streets to whom was referred the joint order of 10th ult. requesting that the Committee confer with the Water Board in regard to wetting the streets with water from the Hydrants, would respectfully report, that the order was laid before the Water Board, and that the wishes of the City Council, were at once acceded to.

The Committee would further report, that the order of the 25th ult. directing them to furnish facilities for watering the West Boston Canal and Prison Point Bridges, has been carried out by contracting with Mr Israel Tibbels to water the Canal and Prison Point Bridges, for the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars for the season, and with the Union Railway Company to water the West Boston Bridge for the sum of one hundred dollars for a similar term; and that the Committee have contracted with the Railway Company to water that portion of the North

Avenue which lies on the easterly side of
the Common, between Garden and Water-
house streets, for the sum of fifty dollars.
This last agreement was in excess of their
powers, but the Committee were induced
to make it, because the street was very dusty,
and extremely disagreeable to all travellers;
and because the arrangement was demanded
as true economy, inasmuch as by wetting
the street, much valuable material would
be saved, which otherwise would certainly
be lost.
