This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the 1954 Internal Revenue Code, or as the same may be subsequently modified, and for no other purposes, including more specifically the following: (as per application for incorporation under form attached)

To lease, purchase, sell or otherwise acquire or dispose of such real estate and personal property as may be necessary for the purposes of the Corporation; and to receive and hold such gifts, donations, grants, devises or bequests of real or personal property as may be necessary to carry out the above-stated purposes.

Provided that no part of the earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual; nor shall a substantial part of the activities of the Corporation be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; nor shall the Corporation participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Upon dissolution of the Corporation, all its assets of whatever nature shall be transferred to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the 1954 Internal Revenue Code or as the same may be subsequently modified, as the Board of Directors shall select.

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

CHURCHMAN'S LEAGUE and Associated Agencies, Inc.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To promote programs of education, study and research among and between persons, institutions and associated agencies having charitable, benevolent and religious concern.

2. To encourage through cooperative effort civic righteousness, social justice, morality and temperance.

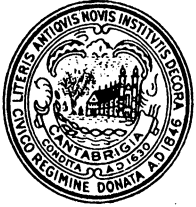
3. To provide for the observance of a common day of rest for the purpose of religious worship.

4. To provide by means of annual awards recognition of persons who by example and demonstrated leadership have consistently brought the power of example and service to bear upon the problems of securing social justice, freedom and equity for everyone.

5. To carry on any other lawful activities whatsoever which may seem to the League to be capable and necessary of being carried on in connection with these purposes, which are calculated, directly or indirectly, to promote the interests of the members of the League.

6. The foregoing shall be construed as purposes which shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner powers of the League not inconsistent with these purposes.

NOTE: If provisions for which the space provided under Articles 2, 3 and 4 is not sufficient, additions should be set out on continuation sheets to be numbered 2A, 2B, etc. Indicate under each Article where the provision is set out. Continuation sheets shall be on 8½" x 11" paper and must have a left-hand margin 1 inch wide for binding. Only one side should be used.

I made an investigation.

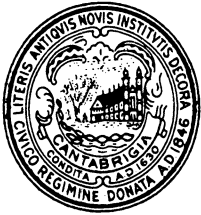
The applicant lives at the address given and has

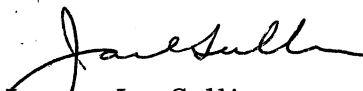
