Resolved: That the City Council offer wishes for a speedy recovery to Randy McNeely of Suffolk Street who was injured in a rock climbing accident and is recovering at Youville Hospital.

61. #2

Whereas; Many businesses, including those in very congested areas of Cambridge receive small deliveries, sometimes only one or boxes, from 65 ft. semi trailer trucks which are grossly oversized for the size of the delivery they are making, and

Whereas: These huge trucks often obstruct traffic while making deliveries, thus creating hazardous conditions for pedestrians, bicyclists, and auto traffic, therefore be it

Ordered: That the City Manager report to the City Council what means and methods are available to the city for the purpose of regulating the size of trucks making local deliveries in congested areas of Cambridge.

Whereas; Citizen complaints about noisy leafblowers persist every summer and fall season, and

Whereas: Past reports from City Departments indicate that this is strictly a noise ordinance issue, but other communities have addressed or are attempting to address this issue in a variety of other ways, including Eugene, Oregon, Los Angeles and San Francisco, therefore be it

Ordered: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to have the Law Department contact these cities and then report to the Council about what ordinances they may have enacted and what means the Cambridge City Council has at its disposal to enact legislation to regulate the repeated use of very noisy equipment such as Leaf Blowers.

63. #4

Whereas; An extra Street Cleaning scheduled to make up for a day lost because of the Memorial Day holiday was appreciated for the clean streets it left in the Wlden Street/Upland Road area, but proved upsetting to those motorists residents whose cars were towed when signs were posted with apparently only 24 hours notice. Many of these residents were out of town without their cars for business or a long weekend and were surprised to find their cars gone when they returned, Therefore be it

Ordered: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report to the City Council the current practice for posting signs for unscheduled street cleaning or other street work which necessitates the towing of cars, and whether this notification, apparently only 24 hours at this time, can be extended in length to take into account the many Cambridge residents who may travel for several days at a time.
