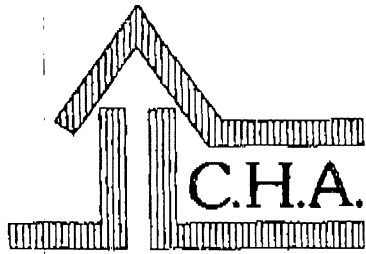

Robert McCormack of Truman Apartments on Eighth Street has been selected by the Massachusetts Neighborhood Crime Watch Commission / DHCD as its **1999 Senior**

Citizen Crime Watch Member of the Year.

Since becoming a resident in 1992, Mr. McCormack has served as a tenant coordinator during the daytime hours and as a building access monitor during the night hours.

In making the announcement of Mr. McCormack's statewide honor, Executive Director Daniel Wuenschel acknowledged "that Mr. McCormack routinely looks out for the safety and comfort of all residents of Truman Apartments and the surrounding streets in East Cambridge."

Mr. Wuenschel pointed out that as a building access monitor, Mr. McCormack works directly with the Housing Authority Security Administrator and his investigators and the Cambridge Police Department.

Mr. McCormack is credited with deterring elderly scams, providing information leading to the arrests of criminals, and preventing undesirable individuals from gaining access to the building. He also observes and quickly reports safety risks such as burned lights in the building and nearby streets and checks doors before retiring at night.

Mr. Wuenschel concluded that Mr. McCormack is truly a worthy recipient of the **1999 Senior Citizen Crime Watch Member of the Year**, and the Housing Authority is most proud of his selection.
