and the public necessity and convenience do not require it.

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3 M. L. Walton, and

Sanford H. Dudley and others, - two petitions for the acceptance of Avon Place. This place extends from Avon Hill Street easterly and westerly, to private property. This also has not been put in condition for acceptance.

4 J. W. Estabrook and another, - for the acceptance of Frost Street, so called, from Harris Street, southerly. This is a court, and at the present time is ^{so} piled up with earth and other materials, that a team cannot be driven into it.
