WHEREAS: The Cambridge Hospital is in the process of purchasing a residential property on Camelia Avenue as well as requesting a discontinuance of part of Camelia Avenue; and

WHEREAS: The City Council has not received any detailed information on whether of these two aspects of the property renovation and new construction for the City Hospital; and

WHEREAS: Many Councillors including myself have been receiving numerous phone calls from Citizens about the whole situation at the Hospital and, in particular, the potential cost increase, for new construction, renovation and acquisition of the residential site at Camelia Avenue and the discontinuance of a part of Camelia Avenue; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to inform the Council of the following information as soon as possible:

A. Any additional information that Ernst and Young may have provided the Hospital as to the financial feasibility of the potential \$6 million increase in cost of construction.

B. Any additional information that the Hospital may have obtained on various proposals for national health care reform and the implications for public hospitals.

C. If the proposed project has been downsized by 14%, why have the projected costs risen by 15%?

D. Copies of all documents pertaining to the proposed purchase of the residential property at Camelia Avenue including its rent control history.

E. Any written information regarding the discontinuance of Camelia Avenue.

Further, that the City Manager is to advise the City Council, if possible, within two weeks with a written report.
