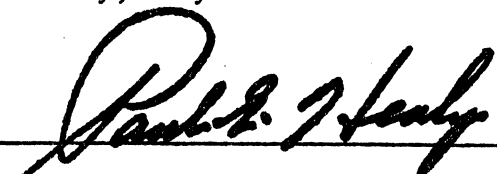

- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Detective Lieutenant Joseph "Babe" Amoroso will retire from active duty on January 31, 1984, completing twenty-nine years of dedicated service to the people of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Lieutenant Amoroso, who served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Navy and upon being honorably discharged, worked for the Commonwealth, assigned to the Public Works Department; and
- WHEREAS: "Babe" began his tenure in the Cambridge Police Department on May 12, 1955 as a Patrol Officer and through competitive examination was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on July 7, 1975 and to his present rank of Lieutenant on April 4, 1983, at which time he was assigned to the Prosecutor's Office at the Middlesex County Courthouse; and
- WHEREAS: Lieutenant Amoroso has steadfastly proven to be an able and expert Police Detective, who has been the recipient of numerous official commendations, some of which recognize his expertise in the homicide area, as well as in the area of credit card fraud; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere gratitude to Lieutenant Detective Joseph "Babe" Amoroso for his dedication in the criminal justice field and for serving as a role model for many years to the members of the Police Department; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Lieutenant Amoroso on behalf of the entire City Council.

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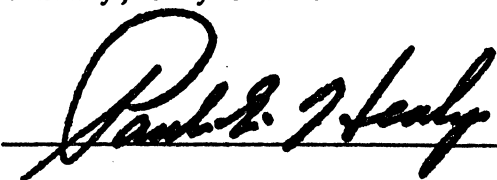

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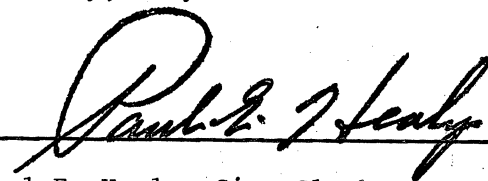
