WHEREAS: The lead headline of the March 16, 1989 Cambridge Chronicle, "Get out your wallets; city taxes are going up", followed by the observation from the Assistant City Manager for Fiscal Affairs James Maloney that "It could (require) a substantial tax increase just to maintain the current level of city services" give Cambridge homeowners good reason to be concerned about the possibility of paying substantially higher property tax bills in the upcoming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS: Relative to the city budget, Cambridge homeowners, indeed all Cambridge residents, have a right to know not only how much is being spent but how well it is being spent, a right to a knowledge of what is in the budget and not just be the recipients of a notification to pay the bills. It is time that the budget be viewed as not merely a book to be read from a distance, but as an open process to be viewed and assessed at close range by the people of Cambridge; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager direct the city's Office of Cable Television to provide live coverage of the upcoming budget hearings for every city department, and insure the presence of maximal publicity both through Cable TV as well as in the Cambridge Chronicle and The Cambridge TAB to the fact that this new opportunity for fiscal accountability to Cambridge residents is being initiated momentarily; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council on March 27, 1989 with confirmation that the foregoing has been accomplished.
