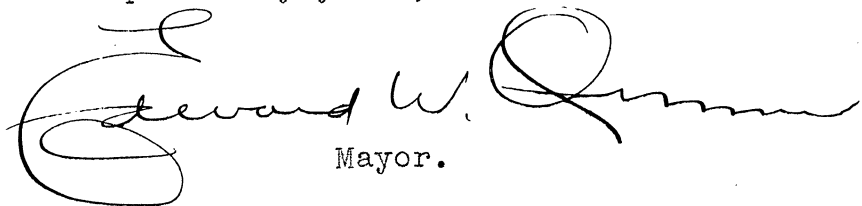
To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to an order from your Honorable Board, passed at its regular meeting on October 25th, requesting information as to what steps any city department has taken to try Capt. Herbert Gordon on charges in connection with the District Attorney's office, I beg leave to reply that at no time, since the hearing of the case before the Supreme Court in which the name of Capt. Gordon was involved, has the Chief of Police lost sight of the matter.

The evidence upon which to proceed on charges against Capt. Gordon, however, were not easily accessible. The Chief of Police has been in constant conference with the City Solicitor in relation to the matter with a view to proceeding properly and legally.

The Chief is now prepared to proceed and has suspended Capt. Gordon from the Police Force today, and a hearing will be had on charges against him at an early date.
