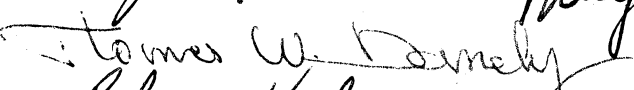
To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

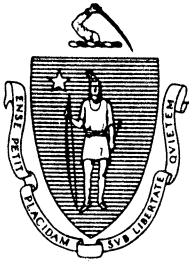

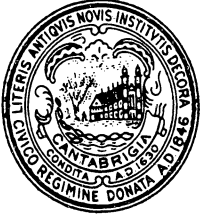
IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY- TWO.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE REINSTATEMENT OF JAMES O'LEARY TO HIS FORMER POSITION OF LIEUTENANT IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the Director of Civil Service, upon request of the appointing authority of the City of Cambridge, shall reinstate James O'Leary to the position of lieutenant in the Police Department of said City, a position formerly held by James O'Leary, provided the said appointing authority submits to the Director of Civil Service in writing the reasons why such reinstatement would be in the public interest.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary in chapter 32 of the General Laws, all money received by said James O'Leary pursuant to section 5 of said chapter 32 shall be refunded to the Cambridge Retirement Board.

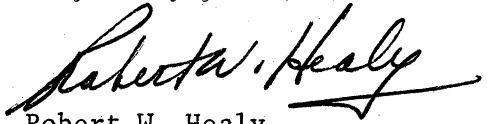
