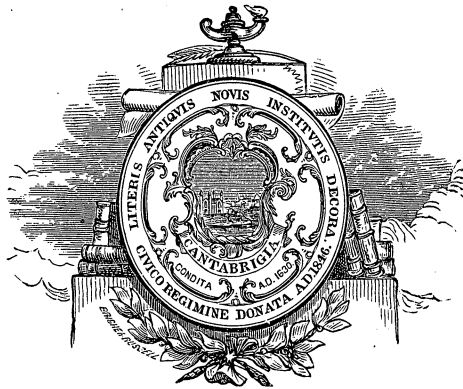


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, *June 7.* 1871.

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the public safety and convenience require that an alteration should be made in the *Sutley* Street line of *Brattle* should be *at its junction with Brattle Square.*

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *Charles T. Dign* *clerk*, and all other persons interested in the *same* *lots* *lots of* *Wesley, Dignelaw & Co.,* or in any other way interested,

that this Board intends to *alter* the Street before mentioned, by ~~taking a~~ *discontinuing a portion of same* portion of ~~land~~ *land* and laying out the same as a public street — and that due notice be given to all persons and parties owning or having any rights in estates that will be benefitted by the said proposed *alteration* of said Street, that this Board intends to assess a portion of the expense thereof upon the estates so benefitted according to law, — and that *Wednesday*, the *21st* day of *June* *annex* at $8\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, *A.* M., is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
