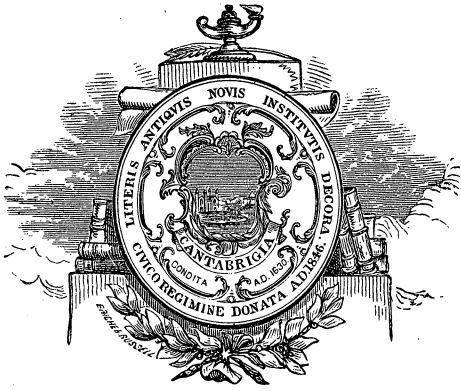




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

Nov 12. 1889

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that a certain private way extending from Irving Sheet, ^{so called} north easterly to Beacon Sheet, or by the same line, and heretofore designated as Irving Crescent

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land fifty feet in width between Irving Sheet and the westerly line of Beacon Sheet, - formerly called Irving Crescent, but to be hereafter called and known as Scott Sheet, -

included between the red lines as shown on a plan drawn by W.A. Mason & Son Surveyors, dated Oct. 20. 1889,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street, and the grade thereof is hereby established in accordance with the profile shown upon said plan.

Ordered that no damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid, the several owners of abutting estates having waived the usual notice, and agreed in writing to make no claim for such damages.

The Committee on Roads and Bridges,

to which was referred the petition of C. B. Norton and others praying for the acceptance of Irving Street, so-called, from Kirkland Street, westerly, and Irving Crescent, from Irving Street, so-called, northeasterly, to Beacon Street, on the Somerville line

Reports,

Recommending

the adoption of the accompanying order, viz:—

Order, accepting and laying out Irving Street from Kirkland Street, westerly, to the lines of Everett Street extended and produced, and establishing the grade of said Irving Street, in accordance with a plan drawn by W. A. Mason & Son, Surveyors, and dated Oct. 20, 1889.

Order, accepting and laying out Irving Crescent, from said Irving Street, northeasterly, to Beacon Street, and establishing the grade thereof in accordance with a plan drawn by W. A. Mason and Son Surveyors, and dated Oct. 20, 1889, — the name of said Irving Crescent, to be changed by agreement of the abutters, and the same to be hereafter called and known as Scott Street.

The customary waiver of notice signed by all the owners of abutting lands, upon the two sheets before mentioned, — is herewith transmitted, the same having been duly acknowledged.
