In Board of Aldermen, May 13. 1860.

The Committee on Roads and Bridges to which was referred the Petition of Joseph Williams and others for the laying out of a street from Mr. Auburn Street to Bow Street, as also the Remonstrance of Leonard M^r Kay against such laying out, would respectfully

Report: That upon hearing the Petitioners and Remonstrant, and upon examining the premises, the Committee is of the opinion that the public necessity does not require that a street should be laid out as prayed for, but is of the opinion that a foot-way over the land of Mr. M^r Kay of five feet in width, and extending from Mr. Auburn Street to Bow Street, would be of great public convenience; and Mr. M^r Kay has stated his readiness to permit the use of such a way across the westerly side of his land, if the City will erect a suitable fence by the side thereof.

The Committee would therefore recommend that no further action be taken upon said

petition, and those the Congress have not submitted
be a defect.
