- WHEREAS: Companies that endorse The Global Sullivan Principles agree to develop policies and procedures that advance the cause of human rights by ensuring equal opportunity for its employees at all levels of employment, providing fair and ethical wages, supplying training and opportunities for workers from disadvantaged backgrounds, and creating a safe and healthy work environment; and
- WHEREAS: One of the main objectives of The Global Sullivan Principles is to enhance partnerships between companies and the governments and communities in which they do business in order to improve the quality of life in those communities; and
- WHEREAS: The Global Sullivan Principles provides all companies with a high ethical standard and a model for conducting business in markets worldwide; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council joins the world leaders, corporate officers, and humanitarians who support The Global Sullivan Principles; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That this City Council extends its deepest gratitude to the author of The Global Sullivan Principles, Reverend Sullivan, a former recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom who is admired around the world for his efforts to dismantle the system of apartheid in South Africa, for his continued dedication to the cause of human rights and the many years he has spent fighting for the disadvantaged.
