WHEREAS:

William J. Carroll was a native of Somerville and a Korean War Veteran prior to his appointment to the Police Department on November 1, 1965, and

WHEREAS:

William J. Carroll was a dedicated and loyal member of the Police Department who impressed all his fellow officers with his quiet manner and the ease with which he handled the difficult problems of law enforcement, and

WHEREAS:

Officer Carroll, the recipient of a letter of commendation, for his actions in saving the life of an infant in the year 1971, and

WHEREAS:

His deep interest in all matters concerning the Police Department was recognized by his colleagues and resulted in his election as Vice-President of the Cambridge Police Association where he became an able and eloquent representative of the department, who won the admiration of all who knew him by his unfailing courtesy and quiet dignity, therefore be it

That in the passing of William J. Carroll the City of Cambridge has lost a police officer who represented the highest standards of public service, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That this City Council go on record extending our condolences to his wife, Joan, and the members of his family in their bereavement, and be it further
