25¢ is charged for admittance; so you
can see that the City will have on its hands
a dancing class, without receiving any
revenue from it; I certainly have no
objection to them for using that bldg.
Sundays night for teaching gaelic. But
I don't think that it is fair to the other
halls in that Vic. There are two clubs now
whilst up to last Jan. was one. The Gaelic
School and the Gaelic Social club. So I

want your ^{council} ~~own~~ to look into this
matter. Which we the lay prayers are
interested in. Furthermore what is there
to stop the Gaelic Social Club from putting
in a petition for the use of a hall
up there. And try and get something
for nothing which they are after
This order was put in by a man
other than the one who is at the head
of it for some unknown reason.
I sincerely hope that you don't act
too quickly on this case without giving
it serious thought.
