



To the Hon. Mayor and Aldermen of the
City of Cambridge:

Your Petitioner respectfully represents that there are two large Elm trees in front of his premises, No. 248 Broadway, which are a great injury to the estate by reason of the roots extending some twenty-five feet under the house, thereby filling the cellar with roots and young trees, and endangering the foundations of the house.

Wherefore your petitioner prays that said trees may be removed, and one horse chestnut, or some other tree less injurious than the present be substituted.
