WHEREAS:-

A review of golf courses in Greater Boston published in the March 28th issue of the Harvard Crimson stated "And there's always the Cambridge Municipal on Fresh Pond which can boast of convenience and nothing else.", therefore be it

RESOLVED:-

That the City Manager request Recreation Superintendent, Paul G. Cowles, to advise the editors of "Cambridge's only daily newspaper":

1. For the FIRST time in the history of American golf courses the Fresh Pond Municipal was completely closed for the entire 1968 season for Renovation of the nine-hole layout at a total cost of approximately \$200,000.00 to the Cambridge taxpayers.
2. The thirty-five year old course, constructed largely from contributions to the Cambridge Unemployment Committee collected by passing the box at Harvard Football Games in 1930-31, can boast, among other things, of a long and distinguished membership list including David Rockefeller A.B. '36, Hasan Mohd Khan M.P.A. '58, and the talented Ethel Waters.
3. That all are invited to patronize and enjoy the renovated course this spring at the revised greens fees

and be it further

RESOLVED:-

That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the President of the Harvard Crimson with a request that it be brought to the attention of the Golf Editor.
