- WHEREAS: Philip Mangano served at the Department of Human Services Programs as Director of Emergency Services from July 1986 to June 1990; and
- WHEREAS: Philip Mangano was an extraordinarily effective leader of a team that achieved considerable progress in improving the quality of life for very remarkable people; and
- WHEREAS: Philip Mangano "catapulted" efforts to develop multi-service center for emergency services at 19 Brookline Street in November 1988, and assisted in opening a Bigelow Street family shelter; and
- WHEREAS: Philip Mangano realizing the importance of group and partnership efforts, worked with St. Paul AME Church to found a family shelter, worked with the YMCA/YWCA for transitional rooms, and worked with multiple city departments to establish emergency services; and
- WHEREAS: Philip Mangano, leading the way with many others, raised large sums of money for servicing people through a variety of of organizations; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council honors Philip Mangano who with others has worked indefatigably to help those in need of help and to make Cambridge a nicer place to live for all of its residents; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be hereby requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Phil Mangano at a gathering planned in his honor on March 22, 1990, on behalf of the Cambridge City Council in appreciation for his efforts as the former Director of Emergency Services.
