To the City Government of Cambridge.
Gents

The undersigned, one of the petitioners to have Ellery Street accepted, understood that the only expense to be incurred must be that arising from the cost of Curb Stones. But he has been required to remove his fence at a cost of about \$40.00 - & relinquish the land taken to widen the sidewalk. He has delayed the payment of the bill of Curbing, feeling that the cost of fencing and value of land taken would be a fair offset for said bill, which he is now constrained to pay, and does so under protest.
