- WHEREAS: Residents of North Cambridge came out in large numbers to express their concerns, dismay, and opposition to Secretary Salvucci's recently submitted highway construction for the Alewife Area, and
- WHEREAS: This construction will greatly affect the quality of life in the North Cambridge area, with increased traffic and unsightly bridge construction, and
- WHEREAS: This construction will also affect the West Cambridge area bringing the traffic bottleneck to the intersection of Concord Avenue and Fresh Pond Parkway; therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That it is the sense of the City Council that in view of the drastic change made from the original plan that:
- (1) A supplemental Environmental Impact Study be made reflecting the changes.
 - (2) Secretary Salvucci appear before the City Council for a hearing on this matter at our April 4th. meeting.
 - (3) If possible, this meeting be held at the Fitzgerald School and televised by American Cable Systems.
 - (4) Our State Representatives and State Senators be notified of the feelings of the citizens of Cambridge and be requested to attend this hearing.
