- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Cambridge native and veteran Cambridge Police Lieutenant Irwin Nolan; and
- WHEREAS: Irwin, a Cambridge native, attended local schools and served his country well during World War II as a member of the United States Navy; and
- WHEREAS: Irwin first entered the employ of the City in 1958 as a Senior Accountant, holding that position until March, 1960 at which time he was appointed a reserve Patrol Officer and being appointed as a permanent Patrol Officer on November 21, 1960, serving in various assignments until his promotion to the rank of Sergeant on July 1st, 1975, serving as a First Line Supervisor until January 9, 1983, at which time he was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant, where he held a leadership position within the command staff; and
- WHEREAS: Irwin served as a role model for members of the Police Department for not only new officers, but those who aspired to supervisory ranks; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Doris Nolan and to the entire Nolan family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Nolan on behalf of the entire City Council.
