WHEREAS: "LIFT EVERY VOICE" will feature the heavenly music of the Mount Cavalry Gospel Choir directed by George Bullock, the Greene Aggregation directed by Kenneth Greene, Ms. Ife Franklin, the Cambridge Rindge and Latin School Gospel Choir directed by Deborah Brown, the Haggerty Elementary School Chorus directed by Carrie Woodson, the St. Paul AME Church New Temple Singers directed by Donnell Patterson, and the St. Marks Congregational Gospel Choir directed by Milton Wright; now therefore be it
