Dear Sir

At a meeting of the
Standing Committee of the Third
Congregational Society held last evening
it was Voted that the Committee on
the House be authorized to employ a
suitable person to replace the steps of
the Church before Sunday.

The above vote was passed, by
reason of the steps having been removed
by order of the City Government, and that
the space occupied by said steps has
been so occupied for over forty years.

They therefore respectfully suggest
that if the City Government desire to
make any change in said steps the
Society are willing to enter into any
reasonable arrangements for the same.
