- WHEREAS: One of the reasons for the slow delivery is the fact that U.S. Post Office Personnel are having difficulty finding legal parking spaces in their delivery areas, thus receiving parking tickets; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager direct the Director of Traffic and Parking to confer with Postal Authorities with the view in mind of providing signs clearly indicating "U.S. Mail Delivery between the hours designated, and the area of delivery so that there will be no abuse of these cards and report back to the City Council with the results of this meeting A.S.A.P.; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this City Council after his meeting with Postal Authorities the results of said meeting.
