WHEREAS: Professor Putnam is a specialist in cross-national comparative politics and international relations and an author or co-author of seven books; and

WHEREAS: Professor Putnam has taught government at Harvard since 1979, then ambitiously moving ahead to become chair of the Department of Government from 1984-1988 and an associate dean in the Faculty of Arts from 1986-1988; and

WHEREAS: Professor Putnam has been the recipient of numerous awards and fellowships, including a Guggenheim Fellowship and Rockefeller Foundation Resident Scholarship; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council sends its warmest thanks to Professor Putnam for his outstanding work as Dean of the Kennedy School of Government and wishes him every success with his teaching and research; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Professor Putnam.
