The amount of rental to be \$554 per year payable in monthly payments of \$46.17

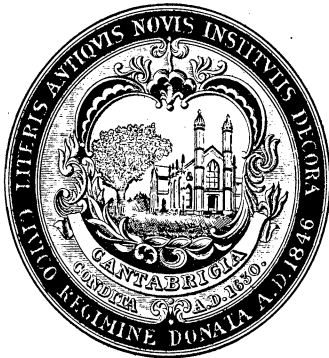
Dear Sir:-

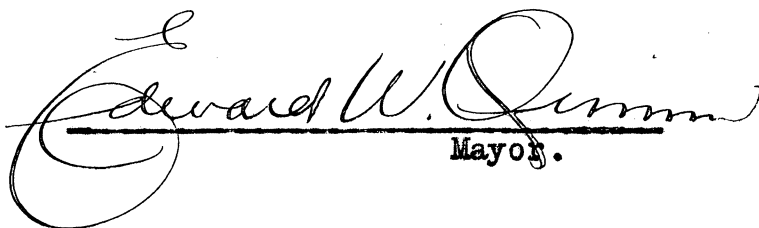
Honorable the City Council of the
