It is the hope of our citizens that Cambridge will continue its traditions, maintain its leadership and strengthen its responsibilities, and

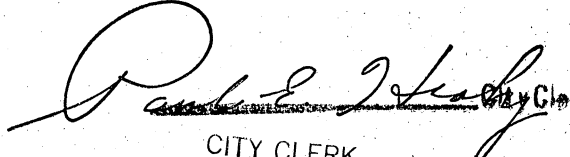
WHEREAS:
