WHEREAS: The strength of our nation, and all of its states and cities, flows from the promise of individual equality and freedom of choice; and

WHEREAS: The seventeenth anniversary of the National Fair Housing Law, Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968, during the month of April, is an occasion for all Americans-individually and collectively-to rededicate themselves to the principle of freedom of choice and to participate in efforts to eliminate vestiges of housing discrimination wherever they exist; and

WHEREAS: Barriers that diminish the rights and limit the options of any citizen will ultimately diminish the rights and limit the options of all; and

WHEREAS: Fair Housing is the policy of the City of Cambridge, and implementation of that policy requires the positive commitment, involvement and support of each one of our citizens; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council proclaim April, 1985 as Fair Housing Month in Cambridge, and ask the people of this City to join in reaffirming the obligation and commitment to fair housing opportunities for all; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is hereby requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Samuel R. Pierce, Jr., the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development.
