- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Max Wasserman, a long time Cambridge resident and real estate developer; and
- WHEREAS: Max attended local schools, graduating from Cambridge High and Latin School and Massachusetts Institute of Technology with a degree in Civil Engineering; and it was while he was an MIT student that he patented a copper-bond flashing method which is used as a waterproofing material for the building industry; and
- WHEREAS: Max was an ambitious businessman and real estate developer, founding a series of companies including Wasco Flashing Company, the Wasco Chemical Company and later the Wasserman Development Corporation, a real estate developing firm which developed properties in Boston, Cambridge, New Hampshire and the Virgin Islands; and
- WHEREAS: Max was also involved in both civic and religious activities including serving as a member of the Council for the Arts at MIT, a trustee of the Cambridge School of Weston and was a founder of Temple Shalom; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Jeanne Wasserman and the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Wasserman on behalf of the entire City Council.
