In response to Council Order #7 regarding the Safe Neighborhoods Initiative, the following information is offered.

Members of the planning committee held a meeting on December 19, 1991 to review the draft Safe Neighborhood Initiative Packet and plans for dissemination. The final packet will be available to the public in mid-January through a variety of agencies, including community schools, libraries, Community Service Division at the Cambridge Police Department, and all existing neighborhood crime groups currently operating. A one page summary of City resources will be developed after the draft packet is disseminated and mailed to all residents in Cambridge (probably with a utility bill). The following neighborhood Councils recently met to develop plans for a Safe Neighborhood Initiative in their respective areas: Kennedy, Harrington, King & Longfellow. These newly formed initiatives combined with already existing groups result in every neighborhood in the city participating in this effort. Neighborhood Councils across the city will play a key role in providing interested residents with information on active groups in their neighborhood, eg., they will act in all neighborhoods as a clearinghouse and in many neighborhoods as the actual sponsor of the Safe Neighborhoods Initiative.

In response to City Council Order #7 of 11/25/91 regarding an update on the progress and development of the Safe Neighborhoods Initiative, the program is being coordinated by the Human Services Department. The Police Department has provided a number of items for inclusion in the Manual.

The Police Department's Crime Prevention Unit visits an elderly housing complex on a daily basis. Programs for all Cambridge Housing Authority complexes are being coordinated with Mr. Mitchell, Security Administrator for the CHA.

"Park & Walk" assignments are being expanded to incorporate all areas of the City. During the month of November, 1991, uniformed officers performed 808 such assignments totalling over 384 hours for the month (an average of almost 13 hours per day).

The Police Department will continue to cooperate and provide any necessary assistance, action, etc., as is required to ensure the success of the Safe Neighborhoods Initiative.

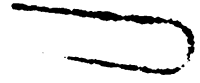
