

City of Cambridge

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and
Sixty-seven,

An Ordinance

in relation to the collection of Taxes.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge as follows:

Sec. 1. Any poll-tax that may, at any time, be
due and payable from any person upon whom
a poll-tax levy is assessed, shall be paid when
demanded; and in case of neglect or refusal
so to pay the same, the Collector shall forthwith
proceed to collect the same in the manner
provided by the laws of the Commonwealth
for the collection of taxes from delinquents.

Sec. 2. The first and fifth sections of the Ordinance
in relation to Taxes are hereby re-
pealed.
