- RESOLVED: That I, Thomas W. Danehy, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, Massachusetts, do hereby proclaim the week of April 22-28, 1979 as National YWCA Week and call on the citizens of our community to join in tribute to this international organization which today is working not only here but also in more than 80 countries to meet the needs of women and girls.
