April 1963 -

City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, May 6. 1867.

Resolved, That the public necessity and convenience require that Otis Street, between First and Second Streets, be laid out as a public highway:-

Therefore Ordered, That Otis Street, between First and Second Streets, be and hereby is laid out and established as a public highway, fifty feet in width and four hundred feet in length, the Northern line of said Otis Street being parallel with the Southern line of Cambridge Street, and at the distance of two hundred feet therefrom.

And whereas it is adjudged that no person will sustain any damage by reason of such laying out of Otis Street, it is

Ordered, That no damages be awarded to any person for land taken for the laying out of said street.

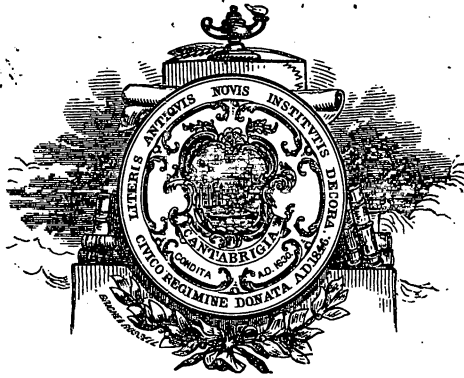

In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, April 22, 1863.

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *William T. Pettigill, Lewis Hall, Francis Staples, Woodbury & Co., and Edmund Leonard,*

that this Board intends to *lay out* the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of *their* land and laying out the same as a public street—and that *Wednesday, the sixth day of May, at 8 o'clock, P. M.,* is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
