Flex Communications ("Company"), a New York corporation, seeks permission from the Department of Public Utilities to provide resold telecommunications services within Massachusetts. The Company proposes to provide message telecommunications service, WATS and 800 services and customized billing and credit-card service.

The above investigation is officially captioned:

Application of Flex Communications, under the provisions of Chapter 159 of the General Laws as amended, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a resale, value-added or interexchange common carrier within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

The Department of Public Utilities will conduct a public hearing on the above matter at its hearing room, 1210 Leverett Saltonstall Building, 100 Cambridge Street, Boston, Massachusetts on Tuesday, April 23, 1991 at 11:00 a.m.

The petitioner, Flex Communications is required to give notice of said hearing by publication hereof once at least twenty-one (21) days prior to said date in the Boston Globe, The Morning Union (Springfield), the Berkshire Eagle (Pittsfield) and the Evening Gazette (Worcester), and to serve a copy hereof at least twenty-one (21) days prior to said date on the attached list, and to make return of service and publication at the time of the hearing.
