WHEREAS: A clean and litter-free urban environment is important for the health and well-being of all city dwellers; and

WHEREAS: It is the right of all Cambridge residents to expect the streets and sidewalks of their city to be maintained in a clean and orderly condition; and

WHEREAS: The condition of the public space in Cambridge's Central Square and particularly the amount of litter in the streets and on the sidewalks continues to create an eyesore for people using this space; and

WHEREAS: With the advent of the warmer weather, it can be assumed that there will be an increase in pedestrian use of Central Square; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council request the City Manager to look into the matter of cleaning up refuse that litters the streets and sidewalks of Central Square in time for the arrival of good weather, and maintaining that standard of cleanliness from then on; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager report back to this Council within one week with a specific Central Square Cleanup Plan, which includes ongoing, multiple cleanings of at least two per day, Monday through Friday, and two per day on the weekends as possible.
