The Executive Office of Communities and Development is pleased to announce that the statewide Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Program will be accepting applications for rental assistance during the latter part of June for the residents of the Boston Metropolitan area. The following is a listing of the dates, places and times where interested persons may apply:

On June 19, 1980 in Sudbury at the Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School at 390 Lincoln Road.

On June 24, 1980 in Randolph at Randolph High School on Memorial Parkway.

On June 26, 1980 in Stoneham at the Unitarian Church, 53 Central Street, opposite the Police Station.

Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis during two sessions on all of these days. Applications will be taken between 9:30 A.M. and 12:00 noon and in the evening between 6:30 P.M. and 9:00 P.M.

The Section 8 Housing Assistance Payments Program is a federally subsidized rental assistance program designed to assist moderate and low income households in paying a portion of their rent in the private market. Eligible households are families, persons over 62 years of age, handicapped, or disabled persons.

Applicants must apply in person unless they are elderly, disabled or handicapped. A special toll-free line has been established for such persons to call and request an application by mail. The number is 1-800-392-6043. Telephone lines will be open from 9:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. every business day starting on June 18, 1980 and ending on June 27, 1980. It is important to note that we have funds for a limited amount of available units. Presently there is an existing waiting list of over 400 families on our 2 bedroom waiting list.
