That whereas the grading, putting in of Edge Stones and Side walks is now being done on the entire north-west side of Maple Avenue, and on nearly the whole of the South-East side of said Street, your Petitioners hereby humbly pray that your Honorable Body may order that the entire work on the South East side of said Avenue may at once be completed uniformly with the northwest side, by making the same improvements on the four vacant lots fronting on the South East side of said Avenue. The public & private use, benefit and convenience now demanding, as your petitioners believe, this completed work, as well as the safety & preservation of the street, the side walk and private property from overflowage and washing, which now exists, and will, until these improvements shall be complete.
