WHEREAS: The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program is now in its 20th year of providing resources to develop better living conditions for persons of low- and moderate-incomes; and

WHEREAS: CDBG funds have been used by City of Cambridge departments and Cambridge non-profit organizations to provide essential community development, economic development and human services for Cambridge residents; and

WHEREAS: Examples of CDBG-funded Cambridge improvements include the 16 dwelling-unit Blouin homeownership project; the Central Square and biotechnology-expansion programs; the 24 current Human Service programs including transportation for elders and handicapped persons to medical services, as well as family-life services for both Hispanic and Portuguese-speaking residents; the major renovation of Hoyt Field; the neighborhood planning work in Area Four and Wellington-Harrington, as well as the City's Growth Policy initiative; and

WHEREAS: The Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, Henry G. Cisneros, has issued a proclamation about CDBG saying "I encourage Americans in communities large and small to examine the good works brought about by this exceptional urban development program"; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council hereby proclaims March 28 - April 3, 1994 to as Cambridge Community Development Week and urges Cambridge citizens to celebrate this observance and to support the CDBG Program all possible ways.
