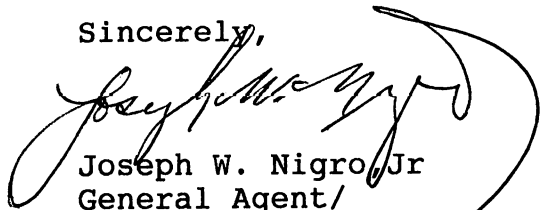
Dear Councillor Myers,
