WHEREAS: The increase in automobile traffic on Cambridge city streets is seriously affecting the quality of life in this city. Finding on-street parking has become a real problem in many, if not most, city neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: It appears from city budget reports that the number of residential parking stickers issued by the city has increased dramatically in the past five years, perhaps as much as 50%, and

WHEREAS: The city budgets of the past five years show a steady increase in revenue from parking tickets and parking fees from meters and city garages, and

WHEREAS: If these increases have been as great as they appear, the City Council may wish to consider implementing policies to discourage increased auto use, such as adjusting the number of parking spaces allowed by zoning, re-assessing the criteria for granting curb cuts, adjusting policies regarding the Residential Sticker Program, and other policies to discourage auto ownership and use; now therefore be it


