SUBJECT: Council Order #034 dated 10/26/98

RE: Replace the bus shelter at Erie and Brookline Streets

There has been a bus shelter on Brookline Street at Erie located at the back of the sidewalk on private property. This summer the property was sold and the new owner wanted the shelter removed from his property. He has also refused to allow the city to install a smaller more attractive shelter on any portion of his property. The sidewalk at this location on Brookline Street is only about six feet in width and there is insufficient room to put a shelter and maintain pedestrian flow without encroaching on private property. The city would need to install the enclosed portion of the shelter behind the sidewalk on the property at 202 Brookline Street near Erie Street. This would involve use of a portion of the private property that is 3 ½ x 10 ½. The city would be responsible for the daily maintenance of the shelter. This Department is trying to get the property owner to reconsider his opposition to having a bus shelter on his site. To date we have been unsuccessful.

Dear Mr. Nugent:

I am sending to you the attached City Council order in which the Council requested that the shelter at Erie and Brookline be put back in service.

When you purchased the property this summer, you called to complain about the shelter and requested that it be removed. Mr. Preston of the Traffic Department requested that you grant the city permission to leave the shelter there or replace it with a smaller more attractive one. The Traffic Department also took on the responsibility of cleaning the shelter daily. You indicated you would think about it as you decided what you would do with your property and get back to Mr. Preston.

Your next call to Mr. Preston was a request to remove the shelter. We asked for additional time to try and relocate it to the other side of Erie Street if the landowner there would allow a shelter. A shelter cannot be placed in this area without encroaching on private property due to the narrowness of the sidewalk. Your response was to pull the shelter into your lot.

I would hope that you would reconsider your opposition to a shelter at your site. The shelter has been well used by the elderly who depend on the bus.
