

# City of Cambridge.

In Board of Aldermen, May 2<sup>d</sup> 1860.

Ordered, That this Board meet at the corner of Main and Townbridge Streets, on Wednesday, the twenty-third inst., at five o'clock, P.M., for the purpose of widening said Main Street, upon the North-easterly side, from said Townbridge Street to the junction of Main and Harvard Streets, by taking private property for public use, viz:— a strip of land ten feet in width, and extending from said Townbridge Street to said junction of Main and Harvard Streets; and laying out the same as a part of said Main Street, and a public highway; and that notice be given to the owners of land abutting on said Main Street, on the North-easterly side thereof, between the points above mentioned, by publishing this order in the Cambridge Chronicle, and by service of a copy of this order upon such owners, according to the statute in such case made and provided, that they may then and there appear and be heard.
