RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Twomey family on behalf of the entire City Council.

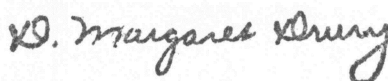

Mary Twomey, of Cambridge, 93, a retired teacher

Mary Twomey of Cambridge, a retired school teacher and advocate for the elderly, died Friday at Bay Path Nursing Home, Duxbury, after a brief illness. She was 93.

Born in Cambridge, she was a lifelong resident and graduated from Cambridge High School and Boston University.

For years, Miss Twomey taught commercial subjects at the old Dorchester High School for Girls. She retired in 1959.

During her long retirement, she became an active and forceful advocate for issues related to the elderly, both in Cambridge and at the state level.

Miss Twomey also was a world traveler with special affection for Ireland and Australia.

She was a member of the Council of Aging and St. Peter's Church, Cambridge.

Miss Twomey is survived by her cousin, Marie Foster of Marshfield; her godsons, Robert and Michael Dunbar of West Newton; and cousins in Cork City, Ireland.

A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Wednesday at St. Peter's Church, Cambridge.
